Northwest Oklahoma: A beautiful land lined with red canyons and blanketed in prairie grass and rich farmland. Riding in an old west cattle drive much like those from the 1800s is another fun-filled activity. Boating, skiing, and golfing are available. These rural communities offer visitors an experience of their rich culture and western art. Various museums depict the early pioneer life and western heritage. Rodeos, festivals, and local arts and craft shows are common.
